TRACEY WADE, MCIP, RPP

TRACEY HAS MORE THAN 20 YEARS OF EXPERIENCE IN COMMUNITY PLANNING IN ATLANTIC CANADA. SHE HAS MANAGED A WIDE-RANGE OF PLANNING EXERCISES IN AREAS OF LAND USE, SUSTAINABILITY, RECREATION, FOOD SECURITY, HEALTH AND CLIMATE ADAPTATION.

SPECIFICALLY RELATED TO CLIMATE CHANGE, TRACEY HAS WORKED ON SEVERAL CLIMATE ADAPTATION PLANS, TRAINED PLANNERS ON CLIMATE ADAPTATION PLANNING, AND UNDERTAKEN CLIMATE-RELATED POLICY WORK. TRACEY IS A FOUNDING MEMBER OF THE CHIGNECTO CLIMATE CHANGE COLLABORATIVE AND IS CURRENTLY ASSESSING COMMUNITY VULNERABILITY AND HEALTH IMPACTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE FOR PUBLIC HEALTH NB. IN 2020, TRACEY BECAME A CLIMATE REALITY LEADER, AN INTERNATIONAL INITIATIVE OF FORMER VICE PRESIDENT AL GORE.

ADRIAN PRADO

ORIGINALLY FROM MONTREAL, ADRIAN MOVED TO NORTHWESTERN NEW BRUNSWICK IN SEPTEMBER OF 2017. AS PART OF HIS WORK IN HIS ROLE AS TERRITORIAL ANALYST FOR THE NORTHWEST REGIONAL SERVICE COMMISSION, HE IS DEVELOPING A REGIONAL CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION PLAN FOR THE COMMUNITIES OF THE REGION, ANALYZING REGIONAL DATA AND NETWORKING WITH VARIOUS PROVINCIAL AND REGIONAL ORGANIZATIONS AND COLLABORATORS. IN ADDITION TO HIS PASSION FOR THE ENVIRONMENT, ADRIAN IS INTERESTED IN SOCIAL ISSUES AS WELL AS THE DEMOCRATIZATION OF SCIENCE, INFORMATION, AND TECHNOLOGY. HE ALSO SITS ON THE COMMITTEES OF FOOD FOR ALL NB, THE NEW BRUNSWICK ENVIRONMENTAL NETWORK'S CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION COLLABORATIVE COMMITTEE AND HIS LSD'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE

JAMES BORNEMANN

JAMES BORNEMANN IS THE GEOMATICS MANAGER AT THE SOUTHEAST REGIONAL SERVICE COMMISSION. HE HOLDS A BACHELORS DEGREE IN GEODESY AND GEOMATICS ENGINEERING AND MASTERS OF SCIENCE IN FORESTRY BOTH FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW BRUNSWICK. SINCE 2010 JAMES HAS BEEN INVOLVED IN MAPPING FLOOD RISK CONSIDERING CLIMATE CHANGE FOR COMMUNITIES THROUGH SOUTHEAST NEW BRUNSWICK. IN RECENT YEARS HE HAS BEEN INVOLVED IN CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION IN LOCAL TO CANADA-WIDE EFFORTS. LOCALLY HE HAS HELPED DEVELOP MULTIPLE CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION PLANS, PROVINCIALLY HE IS A MEMBER OF THE NEW BRUNSWICK CLIMATE CHANGE ADAPTATION STEERING COMMITTEE AND NATIONALLY HE IS PART OF AN ADVISORY PANEL RESEARCHING NATURE-BASED SOLUTIONS TO REDUCE COASTAL AND RIVERINE FLOODING.
